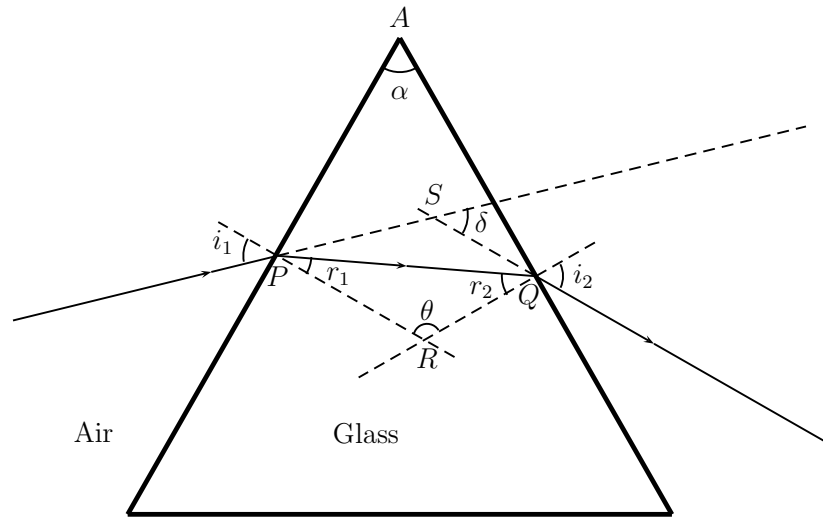


Figure 1: Problem 2
